This light started to shine when St. Ignatius University Kabale (IGUKA) opened its doors on January 8, 2024. The university's acronym is also a word in the local Rukiga language that means "welcome." It is a very appropriate word as all, not just Catholics, are welcome at IGUKA to embark on the transformative journey of academic excellence.

Initially offering degrees in tourism, agriculture, and business administration, the university lacked a crucial department: education. However, through what we believe to be God's providence, Bishop Callist Rubaramira reached out to us for help at the same time when Dr. Nancy Magloire, Ed.D. was discerning her call to mission as a Lay Mission-Helper. Her professional and spiritual journey towards mission perfectly aligned with the university's needs. With a rich academic background spanning from York College and Howard University to Johns Hopkins University, Dr. Magloire's expertise had a potential to become the cornerstone for developing IGUKA's Education Department.

Your support empowered us to guide Nancy through her discernment, training her for mission, and sending her to Kabale. Deeply involved at IGUKA, she spearheads the efforts to develop the Education Department by finalizing curricula for all A.A, B.A. and B.S programs in primary and secondary education and pursues accreditation which is expected to be granted this September. If all goes as scheduled, IGUKA will welcome education students already this November! As you can see, your support of Nancy is paving the way for future

Taking Care of the Lifeline

The Apostolic Vicariate of San Jose del Amazonas is as old as LMH, but it was not until this year that we formed a partnership at the request of Bishop Jose Javier Travieso Martin. The bishop asked us to help the Vicariate with administrative and financial duties, specifically with tracking, monitoring and reporting on projects supported by outside funding.

According to the UN's Human Development Office, over 68% of inhabitants in the area live in extreme poverty. Due to this abject, pervasive and ubiquitous poverty in the area, all services offered by the Vicariate depend on funding from European countries and the United States. Foundations and various organizations that award grants for projects in education, healthcare, environmental initiatives and others have very strict guidelines that must be adhered to in order to comply with legal and ethical requirements associated with those funds. Lack of compliance will result in a demand for the return of the funds and in ineligibility for further assistance. When Bishop Travieso sought our help, he specifically wanted someone who could assist with this crucial aspect of the Vicariate's ability to operate, someone skilled in financial administration and also fluent in Spanish and English.

While not glamorous, our service in the Vicariate is critical because over 168,000 inhabitants of the area depend on the services provided by parishes, clinics, and schools – all supported by outside funders. This lifeline needs to be maintained, cultivated and developed which is our primary responsibility.

As our missionary Maria Luisa Garcia observes, "My ministry/work has to do, not so much working WITH the native population, but rather working FOR the native

population. What I mean is that the job of our office is to make sure that missionaries out at the mission posts have what they need to best serve the folks they minister to."

Your generous support allows us to serve the people in the Vicariate and to assume all the expenses for our mission there, except lodging which is the Vicariate's contribution to our mission. Students, patients, parishioners in the Amazon won't ever meet us, just like they'll never meet you, and yet, our efforts are essential for their access to education, healthcare, catechetical and other services.


